



Winter Fun Fest Orienteering Course 2024



The course starts at the 940 Pavilion (across from the health lodge). There is a pole marked with flagging tape where you should start.

*Head 40° for approximately 375 feet to a tree marked with flagging tape
**With a buddy, estimate the height of the camp flagpole. About how tall is it?

*Face 330° and travel 25 feet to the trail.
*From the start of the trail, travel 240 feet at a bearing of 5° to another tree marked with flagging tape
*There is a One-Way sign 65° from your location. Travel back to the path and go to it.
*Next, travel to a marked tree 195 feet and 15° from your location.
**From this spot, you can see a structure at 200°. What is it?

*A road leads away at about 345°. Follow it for 370 feet to a pair of sheds
**Stand in the middle of the road between the two sheds and face a bearing of 200°. Which shed are you facing?

**Continue on the road for another 400 feet to the Onondaga site shed. With your back against the shed under the site sign, take a bearing to the Onondaga flagpole. What did you get?

**Return to the road and follow for another 640 feet to a tree between two sheds. If you stand at the tree, which shed is North of your location?

**Continue on the road for another 770 feet to a stop sign. What building is at a bearing of 120° from the stop sign?

*Turn to face 30°. Follow the road that goes in that direction for 385 feet to the Mohican Site Shed.
**Standing under the Mohican Shed sign, take a bearing to the flagpole in the

parade field. What did you get?

*Continue on the road for another 800 feet to where a small road breaks off to the right. A tree is marked that has an exit sign. From that tree, the road goes at a bearing of 200° from the exit sign. Follow the road for 190 feet to the sign for the fire circle.

**From the fire circle sign, take a bearing to the middle of the Gaga Ball Pit. What did you get?

*Continue on the road for 565 feet to the Scoutcraft shed. From the shed, take a bearing of 275° and follow that bearing back to the 940 Pavilion to check your answers!

Geocaching Waypoints

Use a GPS or Google Maps on a smart phone to find the Geocaching signs. They are on brightly colored laminated paper. They are close to each set of coordinates. Write down the letters of each waypoint you find.
